# Tips for easy orientation in the main faculty building (Aškerčeva 2):

    (a) The name of the classroom consists of 3 digits > 1st digit = floor:

            1st digit 1 > on the 1st floor
            (e.g., 102)

    1st digit 2 > on the 2nd floor (e.g., 201)

            ...
```

- (b) the first digit is 0 (one or two more digits follow): basement (e.g., 02)
- (c) There is only 1 digit OR

  there are only 2 digits & the first one is not 0

  ground floor
  (e.g., 5 or 18)
- (d) one digit,-Rim.' (e.g., 1-Rim.) = entrance to the classroom from the courtyard behind the building
